Re: **Canvass of the August 13, 2019 Municipal Primary Election**

Overview

The Springdale Municipal Primary Election has concluded and is ready for canvass. The purpose of a canvass is to verify the election returns and make an official declaration. Five citizens declared candidacy for two four-year Council seats and the intention of the Primary Election is to eliminate one of those candidates.

At the canvass, the Town Clerk will have a record of the total votes cast. The Council, serving as the Canvass Board, will examine the election materials to ensure every ballot is accounted for and included in the election totals. You can ask any questions about the count and/or the election.

During the canvass you will review the official register book, and consider the documentation prepared during ballot tabulation.

A report certifying the accuracy of the count will be prepared for the Canvass Board and, if satisfied with the results, you will sign it and instruct the Town Clerk's Office to do the following:

- 1) send the certified canvass report to both the Lieutenant Governor and the Washington County Election Clerk Office;
- 2) post and publish the certified canvass as required by law;
- 3) post the certified canvass on the Town website.

The four remaining candidates will participate in the General Municipal Election to be held November 5th. As you know, Springdale is a vote-by-mail precinct so registered voters will again submit ballots in this way.

Recommendation: Move to declare the canvass of the 2019 Springdale Municipal Primary Election complete and officially announce the four candidates that will move on to the General Municipal Election in November.
