Town Council:

Please consider the following input for the discussion on the Springdale History and Visitor Center. Trying to reuse a dilapidated wood structure at great expense seems unwise, I concur with the thinking presented in the Town memo on this matter.

I have heard significant discussion regarding a town square from various members of the community—particularly those vying to be mayor in four months. Please consider combining the history center with an outdoor square. An outdoor space is more useable, more cost effective, more sustainable, and more durable than an indoor public space. Shade structures, history kiosks, bathrooms, and perhaps a water feature could be incorporated.

The current community center can be utilized if historical presentations are scheduled. The community center could also be utilized to display valuable historical objects that wouldn't be safe in an outdoor setting. A well-developed history website could present more information in a more accessible format at a much more economical price than any amount of displays in a building.

Please simplify and multipurpose the history center effort.
