Petty and Sons and people of Springdale have opened the Zion Road. We hope the county will help to defray the expenses as they are quite heavy."

Dark Sky? Why Bother?



So, what's all the buzz about this Dark Sky stuff in Springdale? Why are people so interested in it? Why is it important? Springdale has the opportunity to become what is known as a Dark Sky Place. There are currently 180 certified International Dark Sky Places around the world. Springdale has already been taking steps in the direction of becoming Dark Sky Certified with things like our lighting ordinances we have already adopted. Lighting ordinances are important to help us reduce what is called light pollution.

According to the Dark Sky Society, a night sky advocacy group based in Long Island, New York, the key to preserving dark night skies is preventing light pollution. Light pollution is broadly defined as light that does not serve a productive purpose. For example, light that is directed upward illuminating only the sky, or outside lights that are left on when not needed.

Did you know that 50% of children born since 2000 will never see the Milky Way? This will be due to light pollution. Most people living in the US and Western Europe are able to see fewer than 200 stars on any given night. In Springdale we have an opportunity to keep the night sky alive for future generations. Our neighbors in Zion National Park have already led the way and are officially a "Dark Sky Place."

There are other benefits to the Dark Sky as well, such as economic benefits. Protecting dark skies in Springdale will help the Town promote itself as an astro tourism destination. Astronomy / Star Gazing are increasingly popular tourism attractions and are shown to increase the number of tourists that spend the night in Town. This will contribute to increasing the revenue of our local businesses overall. Places like Bryce Canyon and Cedar Breaks have hosted successful "Star Parties" that are multi-day festivals that encourage multiple day stays and are just a lot of fun.

Happy October from the Library

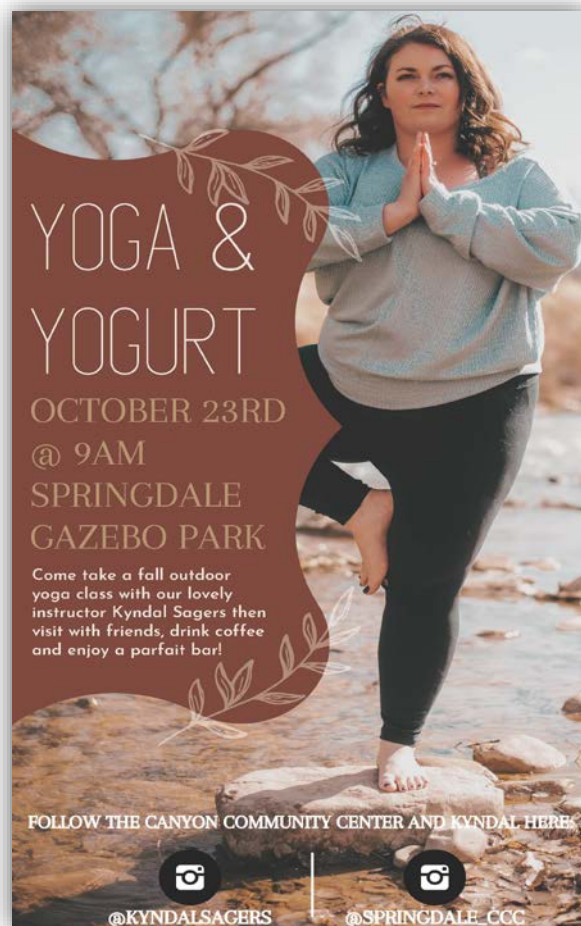
We have a month full of fun!
