KEEPING SPRINGDALE LITTER-FREE

A couple of weeks ago, I was "plogging" along SR-9, and I ran into a long-time resident of Springdale. She was surprised and a little disappointed to see me picking up litter. She told me she used to do the same, but she resents the visitors who cause the problem and is no longer willing to clean behind them.

I share this resident's concern about inconsiderate visitors who don't properly dispose of their trash. However, it is more important to me to live in a litter-free environment. I was a plogger for decades in Salt Lake City, and I'll continue to be a plogger here. I do it for me, not for the visitors.

Please help keep Springdale litter-free by cleaning up in front of your own property. Consider adopting a portion of SR-9 if you have the time and physical ability to do so. The Town has a street sweeper, thanks in part to a generous contribution from UDOT, but that can't take care of the litter on the sidewalks and trails.

P.S. Plogging is a combination of walking or jogging with picking up litter. It started as an organized activity in Sweden around 2016. As a workout, it provides variation in body movements by adding bending, squatting, and stretching to the main action of walking.

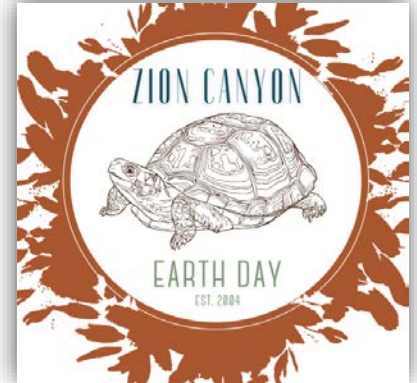

Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Transient Lodging Task Force Update

On January 12th of this year the Town Council adopted a temporary moratorium on new transient lodging. At that time the Council also appointed a task force to develop proposed updated transient lodging land use regulations.

The task force has been meeting regularly over the past two months. The task force has analyzed the specific issues of transient lodging in Springdale. As part of this process the task force has separated the issues associated with transient lodging in specific from the issues related to increased visitation to Springdale and Zion National Park in general. The task force is focused on addressing the issues specific to transient lodging.

The task force has researched the transient lodging strategies of other communities. They have reviewed toolkits and best practice resources available from state agencies like the Community Development Office, as well as non-profit organizations such as the Gateway and Natural Amenity Region (GNAR) Initiative. The task force recently asked for community input through a community survey which generated over 100 responses.

Based on all this research and analysis the task force is now preparing strategy recommendations to present to the Planning Commission and Town Council. The task force anticipates bringing initial recommendations to the Planning Commission during their work meeting on May 4, and a final recommendation to the Commission on May 18. After holding a public hearing to gather additional community input the Commission will make a recommendation regarding the proposed revisions to the Town Council. The Council will act on the recommendations in June or early July.

Springdale Parks Update

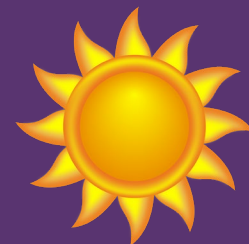
To avoid runoff from the grass you may need to schedule several shorter water cycles in the same day, allowing about 30 minutes in-between for the water to soak in. This is called “cycle and soak” and is easily programmed into your irrigation control.

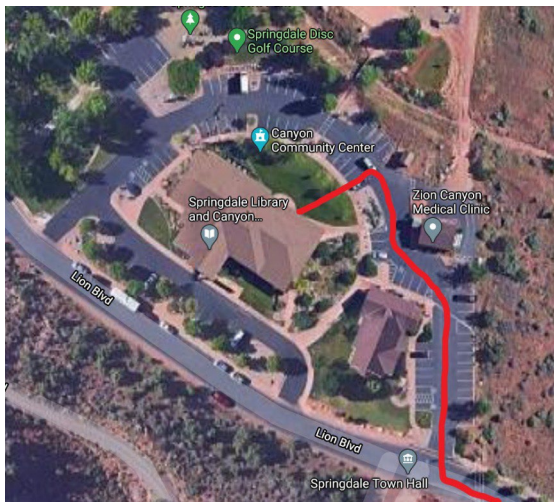
ADDITIONAL SERVICE PROVIDED BY SPRINGDALE / ROCKVILLE TOWNS:

Springdale Dog Licensing (due May 1, 2022): \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$40 for unaltered dogs.
Rockville Dog Licensing (due December 31, 2021): \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$15 for unaltered dogs.
