### LET'S MIX IT UP

The transient lodging taskforce has completed its research and deliberation, and they presented a recommendation to the Planning Commission on May 18. The Commission passed a motion recommending that the Town Council adopt the new ordinance at their next regular meeting. The entire background and proposed ordinance can be found on the Springdale Town website or in the June 8 Town Council packet. However, I'll summarize the recommendation here in this article.

The taskforce identified Type 1 and Type 2 transient lodging units. Type 1 are what you might consider "traditional" hotel properties. This type of lodging has a staffed front desk or concierge desk to assist guests, provides routine support services, and is contained in a structure that is purpose-built for lodging and cannot easily be converted to another use. Type 1 lodging has not been responsible for the conversion of residential structures and commercial uses to nightly rentals and provides a "quasi-public" benefit by offering amenities such as restaurants and retail shops.

## Water Conservation in Springdale

*This is the first in a series of articles intended to educate and inform the community about important water issues.*

The State has been in a severe or exceptional level of drought for many years. In April, Governor Cox declared a state of emergency regarding the drought level. Our May newsletter discussed the executive order and its ramifications on the Town.

The Town of Springdale has had a Water Conservation and Management Plan for some time. The last adopted version of the plan was done in 2017 and is planned to be updated in 2023, along with developing a drought response plan. The Water Conservation Plan includes goals for the community that will assist in water conservation in Springdale.

One goal found in the current plan is a reduction in residential water use. This use is commonly described as "gallons per person per day" or "gallons per capita per day" or GPCD. While residential use is important to understand, there are commercial and agricultural uses that also use significant amounts of water.



While we are at the "top of the ditch" so to speak, the water that flows in the Virgin River through Springdale and on to the rest of the county provides the backbone of water in our region. We need to do our part to ensure that water is used in the best possible ways. In the May newsletter we shared a list of ideas that will help to conserve water in Springdale.

Some additional ways to help conserve water include:

- Following the irrigation schedule. Time of day watering matters. Moisture is often lost during the high daytime temperatures. Watering in the early morning or evening keeps the moisture from evaporating and being lost. The irrigation schedule has been included as an attached flyer.
- Follow the weekly lawn watering guidelines produced by the State of Utah. The weekly watering guide takes data from weather patterns and evapotranspiration rates and simplifies it into a county-by-county map showing how many days per week to water grass and landscaping in each county. - Review the State water conservation goals: <https://conservewater.utah.gov/regional-water-conservation-goals/> and make a plan for your property based on those goals.

## Let's Mix It Up *(Continued from page 1)*

Type 2 are transient lodging units with no full-time on-site staff, no support services, and contained in a structure that can easily be converted into another use or converted from another use to lodging. Recent growth in transient lodging has been primarily Type 2 lodging. These units have led to housing affordability and availability issues, decreased the diversity of commercial services and amenities, impacted the character of the community, increased property values (further reducing affordability for residents), and increased the potential for noise and other nuisances for neighbors.

Our proposed ordinance makes Type 1 transient lodging units an allowed (permitted) use in the commercial zones and adds development requirements such as having a mixed-use component. Type 2 transient lodging units will require the approval of an overlay zone and will be a legislative decision by the Planning Commission and the Town Council. This gives us more discretion on where the Type 2 lodging is located and how it impacts surrounding properties. Type 2 lodging also has increased development requirements similar to Type 1 as well as a requirement to have local management.

The taskforce believes this will result in less of what we don't want (transient lodging units with no public amenities and no on-site management) and more of what we do want (a diversity of long-term housing and commercial uses).

## 2022 Outdoor Summer Movie Series: Musicals

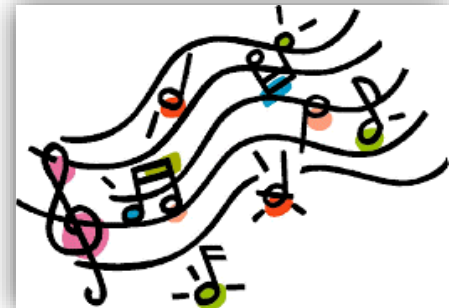
Summer is almost here, and that means it's time for movies in the park!

### Fire Restrictions in Springdale

Given the continued drought conditions in and around the Town of Springdale, the threat of fire is high. In order to preserve the health of the Town's citizens, promote the prosperity of our community, and protect property within Springdale, the Town Council, in conjunction with the Hurricane Valley Fire District, has adopted an ordinance to prohibit open fires and the discharge of fireworks during the 2022 fire season.

From June 1, 2022 through September 15, 2022, it is unlawful to discharge fireworks in the Town. It is also unlawful to have an open fire in the Town of Springdale; however, the term open fire does not include the following:

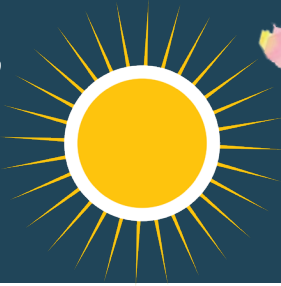
- The use of LPG gas/natural gas and charcoal briquettes in contained BBQ grills, covered stoves, and devices (e.g., Coleman stoves, Weber, or other BBQ grills);
- A fire in an approved fire pit at an improved campground, provided that the campground complies with Code Section 4-9-4; or
- A fire in an approved fire pit provided that it is not left unattended.
