CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW?

I'm not sure how many residents of Springdale have a landline telephone at their homes. If you do have a landline, you may be interested to know that the parent company of CenturyLink has filed a petition to be released from their "carrier of last resort" responsibility. That responsibility requires CenturyLink to provide service to any customer in a service area that requests it, even if serving that customer would not be economically viable at prevailing rates. The final hearing on this matter is scheduled for May 18, 2023, and it is expected that the request will be granted.

We don't know whether CenturyLink will continue to offer landline phone service in the Town of Springdale if they are not obligated to do so. What we do know is that residents of Springdale rely heavily on their cell phones to make calls and receive texts, emails, news alerts, etc. I receive many calls and emails about poor reception throughout the Town, especially on busy holiday weekends.

Anecdotally, most residents who contact me are using AT&T, Verizon, or T-Mobile for their cell service. The Town is working with

Springdale Elementary Installs a New Sign

Both Utah State law and the Springdale Town Code exempt school districts from certain provisions of local land use regulation. Specifically, Washington County School District is exempt from the Town's sign ordinance. This means the School is able to install a sign that does not meet the design, appearance, size, and illumination standards that all other signs in the community must meet.

The School has recently installed an electronic, changeable message sign. This sign will be used to convey school information to parents of school children, as well as announcements to the community regarding school events.

Although the School District is exempt from the Town's sign regulations and the sign does not meet Town standards, the School Administration has committed to operate the sign in keeping with the spirit and intent of the Town's standards as much as possible. The sign will be turned off in the evenings and overnight, will avoid use of animation and video, and will be adjusted to a low level of illumination.

these providers to improve our service in all areas of Town. If you attended or watched the February Town Council meeting, you heard a presentation by a representative of Verizon about macro and micro communication facilities to solve reception problems. There are pros and cons to both, and we have an ordinance in place to assign a preferential order to requests for additional facilities. That ordinance is Town Code 10-27 if you're interested in a little light reading.

In any case, the Town recognizes the need for wireless communication facilities to provide efficient services for residents and visitors. The Town also recognizes that the unique scenic vistas and viewsheds surrounding the Town are one of our most important natural resources. We want to minimize the impacts on adjacent properties and surrounding areas. To that end, Council members Lisa Zumpft and Jack Burns are working with the Community Development Department to determine how to best balance those two needs. They will also determine whether our ordinance should be updated to better reflect current technology. I'm sure they'd welcome comments and input from members of the community. Their email addresses are lzumpft@springdale.utah.gov and jburns@springdale.utah.gov. You may also receive a survey (I know, *another* survey) asking for your opinion. Thanks in advance for commenting and/or responding to that survey.

Winter Driving

Like everyone in southern Utah this year, National Park Service road maintenance staff have stayed busy keeping roads clear. Zion National Park's road crew is responsible for working before dawn, after dusk, and through the day to keep roads passable for drivers. With roads at relatively low elevations near Springdale in Zion Canyon and at higher elevations in Kolob Canyons, Kolob Terrace Road, and on the park's east side, conditions can vary widely.

Whether you visit Zion after a winter storm or anytime during colder months, remember to:



- Watch for ice and snow on the road.
- Slow down and be especially careful near construction projects.
- Be mindful of visitors who may be crossing the road.
- Lower your speed to account for slippery roads and longer stopping distances.

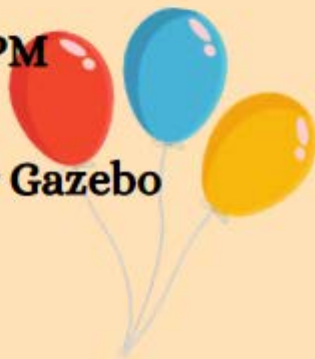

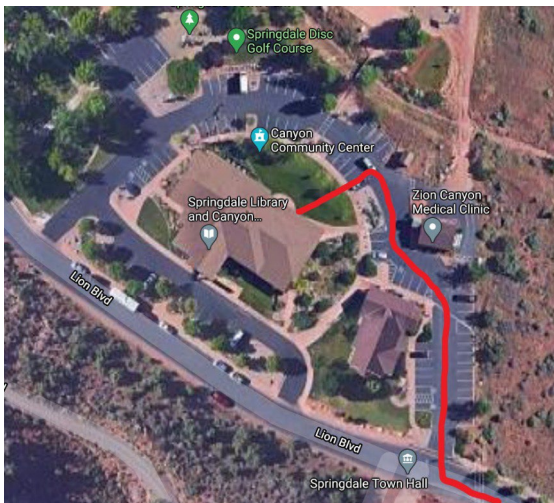
ADDITIONAL SERVICE PROVIDED BY SPRINGDALE / ROCKVILLE TOWNS:

Springdale Dog Licensing (due May 1, 2023): \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$40 for unaltered dogs.
Rockville Dog Licensing (due December 31, 2022): \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$15 for unaltered dogs.
