WE ARE ALL VISITORS

My husband and I just returned from a trip to Barcelona, Spain. We had planned to go in 2020, but then Covid happened and Spain closed down. We met our friends from Portland, Oregon. We did all of the touristy things and some not-so-touristy things.

We rented an Airbnb in a residential neighborhood. It was legal. The website displayed the license number, and we paid a daily per-person guest tax to the City of Barcelona. It was in a 7-story building with four apartments per floor, so there were quite a few people coming and going through the lobby and into the elevator. We couldn't help but notice that the people we encountered were pretty unfriendly toward us. We learned that they were not happy about the nightly rental unit in their building (and, for that matter, in their neighborhood).



Open Space and Water Conservation Initiatives



The Planning Commission is working on two exciting initiatives that will help fulfill some of the goals in the recently adopted General Plan: open space planning and water conservation strategies. The Commission will discuss these two topics in their monthly work meetings (held the first Wednesday of each month at 5 pm).

The General Plan directs the Town to protect open space in order to preserve important community viewsheds, protect wildlife habitat, and enhance community character. The Planning Commission has begun work on a plan that identifies important areas of open space that could be preserved and outlines tools and techniques to ensure these areas remain open space.

Although this winter has brought above-average precipitation, southern Utah and Springdale remain in a multi-year drought. The Town has a limited supply of water. In order to make the wisest use of water and to enhance the Town's resilience to drought, the Planning Commission is investigating strategies to promote more efficiency. The Commission may consider strategies for water conservation in new development and redevelopment projects. The Commission may also discuss community outreach and education efforts to promote water conservation.

We encourage your participation in these planning efforts by submitting your ideas and suggestions about open space or water conservation in writing to tdansie@springdale.utah.gov. The Planning Commission values all comments and suggestions from the community. You can also participate by watching the Commission's work meetings on the first Wednesday of each month, either in person at the Canyon Community Center or online through the YouTube link in the Commission meeting agendas.

The Recycle Binnies are back! With the work on Black's Canyon Wash complete the recycle binnies have returned to their normal location past the water treatment plant on Lion Boulevard.



Declaration of Candidacy Period

The Town of Springdale will hold a Municipal Election this year to fill two open Town Council positions. Each position is for a term of 4 years.

Interested persons may declare their candidacy in person with the Town Clerk's Office, between June 1 – 7, at the Town Offices located at 118 Lion Boulevard.

To be a candidate, you must have the following qualifications:

1. Must be a United States citizen; and
2. Be a registered voter in the municipality; and
3. Be at least 18 years old at the time of the next election; and
4. Be a legal resident of Springdale for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election; and
5. Not be convicted of a felony.



If necessary, a Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 15, 2023.

The Municipal General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

All candidates for election are subject to Campaign Finance Disclosure regulations. If you have any questions, please contact the Clerk's Office at 435-772-3434.




