FIBER TO EVERY HOUSEHOLD

I mentioned in the January 2023 newsletter that one of the initiatives we are working on is getting fiber optic internet to every resident of Springdale. The State of Utah has announced "Connecting Utah," a new statewide initiative to expand high-speed internet throughout the state. The program is intended to make high-speed internet available, accessible, and affordable for every Utahn. Of course, subscribing to the service will be optional, but at least everyone will have the option.

As part of the planning process, Connecting Utah wants to identify the areas with the greatest need for improved internet service. We are fortunate to have two fiber optics providers with lines on SR-9 in Springdale. This means we only need funding for the "last mile," bringing fiber to the residential properties. In other areas of the state, no fiber is available, and it will be a longer, more expensive process.

Please take the 60-second internet speed test at <https://speedtest.utah.gov>. The more residents that take the test, the better our chances are of getting funding. Please also encourage your friends and neighbors (and residents of Rockville) to take the test.

Air Quality Task Force & PurpleAir Air Quality Monitoring

Some years ago, concerns over air quality, particularly the air quality and health impacts of fugitive dust from construction activities prompted the creation of an air quality task force within Washington County. The Task Force is a partnership between construction companies, the Association of General Contractors (AGC), and local and state agencies. The Town of Springdale is a participating member of the Task Force.

The primary focus of the Task Force is public education and awareness of fugitive dust. Attached to the newsletter is a flyer that the Task Force developed to provide information on dust from construction sites and contact information for concerns. Concerns are relayed back through the Task Force and the AGC to the contractor to make corrections in operations.

The Task Force also promotes the establishment of air quality monitoring sites throughout the County. PurpleAir air quality sensors have been installed throughout the State and Washington County (including in Springdale) and provide real-time data on the air quality. The PurpleAir map and information on data collection can be found at map.purpleair.com. Within the map, a user can select several air quality data sets. Fugitive dust impacts the PM10 quality index and is the main concern of the Task Force.

High Water in Zion

We all know the Narrows can be a great place to hike, but, especially at this time of year, it is important to plan ahead because high water can affect access. In past years when there has been significant winter and spring precipitation, it has affected water flow in the Virgin River through the Narrows. Check the [Narrows webpage](#) on Zion National Park's website to see a table that shows information about the last decade of closures in winter and early spring, and take a look at the [US Geological Survey stream gauge](#) to get up to date information about current flow to share with visitors.

Help Improve Broadband in Springdale

You can help shape the future of high-speed internet in Springdale and Rockville. Is your internet service slow, nonexistent, or too expensive? There is funding coming to Utah to increase high-speed internet accessibility. Your input is needed to make sure some of that funding is directed to improving online connectivity in Springdale and Rockville. Here is how you can help:

- Take the 60-second Utah Internet Speed test at speedtest.utah.gov. Information gathered from the tests will impact where broadband expansion occurs. The more test results showing poor connection in Springdale, the more likely funding will be directed our way to improve online accessibility. If you do not have internet, please share your input by calling 435-264-8880.
- Share your story by taking the High-Speed Internet Survey at allonline.utah.gov. The survey and website information are also available in Spanish.
- Encourage your family, friends, neighbors, and colleagues to take the speed test and survey. The more you help spread the word, the greater impact it will have on the future of high-speed internet in Springdale.
- The survey and website information are available in English and Spanish.

Connecting Utah, an initiative of the Utah Broadband Center, will use the results of the speed tests and surveys to determine where to direct federal funding designated for improved broadband access. Connecting Utah's goal is to make high-speed internet available, accessible, and affordable for every Utahn.

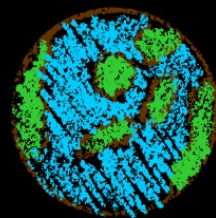

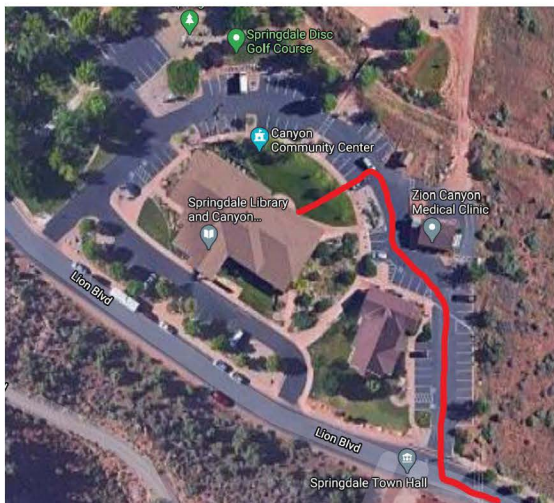
ADDITIONAL SERVICE PROVIDED BY SPRINGDALE / ROCKVILLE TOWNS:

Springdale Dog Licensing (due May 1, 2023): \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$40 for unaltered dogs.
Rockville Dog Licensing (due December 31, 2022): \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$15 for unaltered dogs.

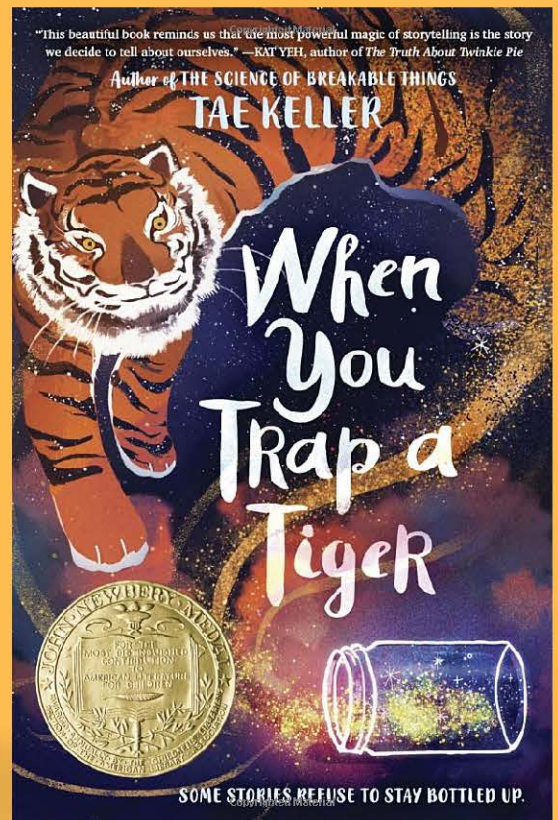

Together we need to focus on preserving our good air quality. We can only achieve this through a conservative effort by all.

TOP TEN DUST CONTROL MEASURES

1. Create and follow a Dust Control Plan.
2. Pre-water area prior to excavation activities.
3. Install and maintain Track-Out Pads on jobsites.
4. Establish designated parking for jobsite personnel.
5. Limit access points for construction site.
6. Cover truck material loads on public highways.
7. Reduce speeds on haul roads. (Max. Speed 10 mph.)
8. Maintain water systems on crusher plant operations.
9. Create crusting of top soil on non-working projects.
10. Stop operations on high wind days (30 mph+).
