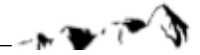

STREETSCAPE PHASE ONE

You may recall that we formed a Streetscape Committee in early 2022. That Committee was tasked with working on a consistent visual theme throughout the Town of Springdale. Components included the entry feature, sidewalks, crosswalks, public art, public gathering spaces, interactive design elements, self-guided tour, SR-9 property in front of the Best Western Hotel, shade elements, site furnishings, bike racks, and landscape lighting. We sent a survey to the Springdale email list, posted it on the website, and held an in-person event to walk around Town and give input.

Earlier this year, the Committee re-grouped and chose two priorities from the list: crosswalks and the SR-9 property. These are the two items we are actively working on at the present time. I am a member of the SR-9 property committee.

Three possible designs for the property "rose to the top" in the survey, and we are hoping to combine our favorite elements of each of those designs. To that end, we have hired Kimley-Horn (the consultant we used for the previous activities) to create a new rendering with our changes incorporated.

Fire Sense is Common Sense

With temperatures rising and dry weather in the forecast, wildfire is more likely in Southern Utah. In Zion National Park and the surrounding area, wildland firefighters have already responded to several fire starts. Remember that no matter where you travel and especially at Zion:

- Check to make sure there are no fire restrictions before you start a campfire, and never leave a fire until it is out cold.
- In Zion, fires are only allowed in designated, metal fire rings in campgrounds. Fires are never allowed in park Wilderness.
- Your car engine may be hot, especially after long drives. Park away from dry plants.
- Check chains on trailers to make sure they don't drag under your car.
- Using fireworks is prohibited all the time on public lands.

Scotch Thistle – A Beautiful Nuisance

Scotch Thistle is a noxious, widely spread, and invasive weed not native to Utah. Many have raised concerns about the growing number of thistle patches in Springdale and the need to educate the community on managing its growth.



Scotch Thistle primarily invades disturbed lands. Growth control should be directed at reducing or eliminating new or expanding populations. The plant grows rapidly, and its large size reduces available resources for smaller plants. It competes with and decreases desirable forage and can act as a living barbed-wire fence, preventing wildlife access to feed and water. Once we get that design, a Request for Proposal will be sent to landscape architects and construction firms. We anticipate that the project will be a design/build project, meaning that the contractor will overlap the design and construction phases of the project.

We do not yet have an estimated completion date, but we recognize that the property in its current state is unsightly. We will keep you apprised of the design, cost, and construction date once we finalize those details.

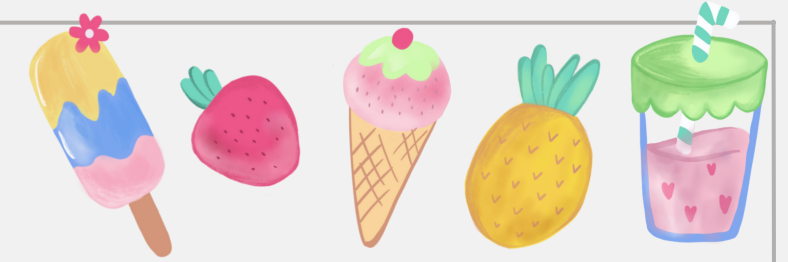

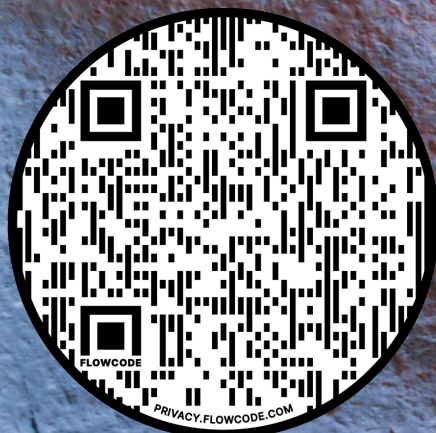

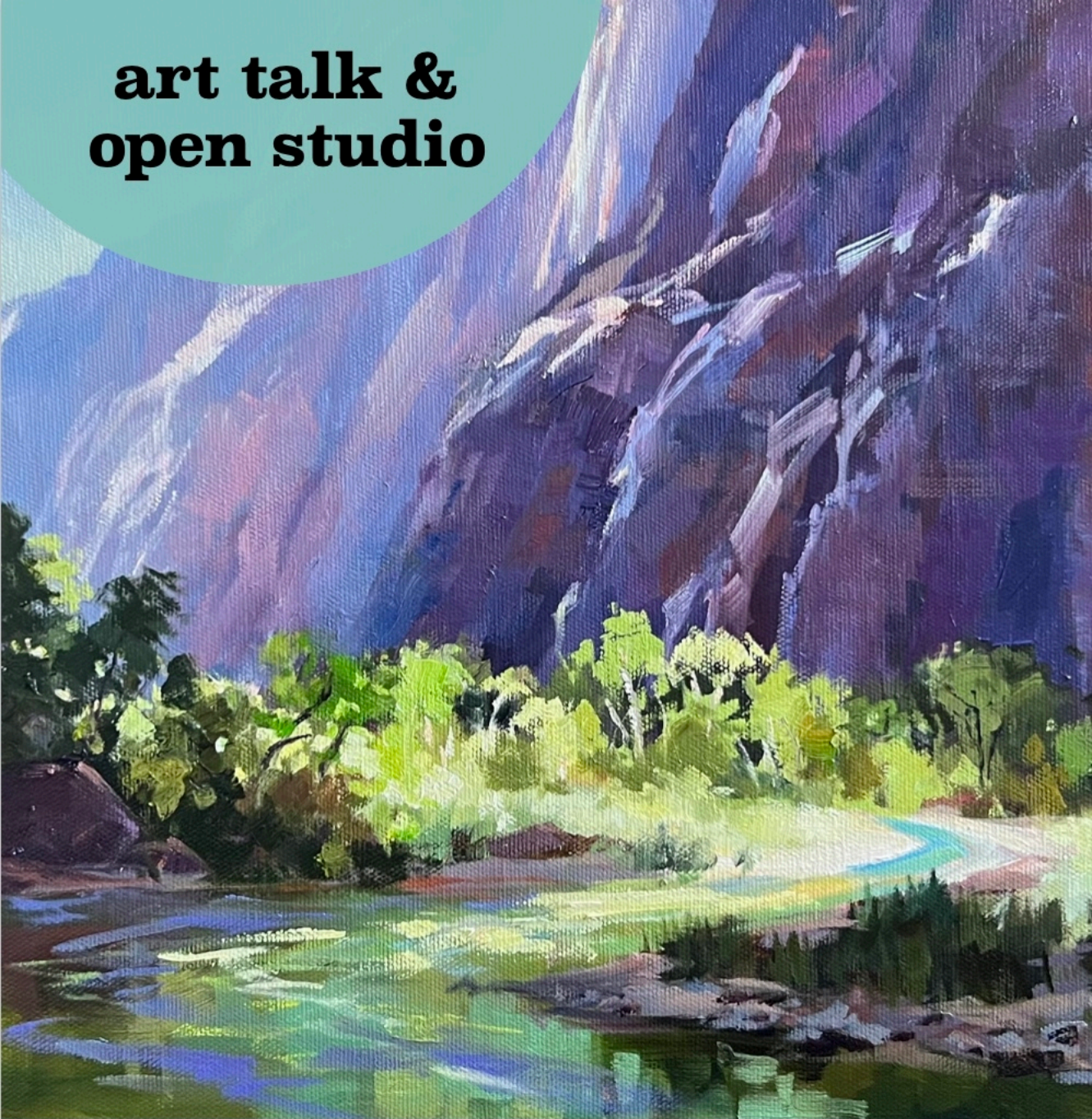
