In Case You Missed It

If you attended (or viewed the video of) the February Town Council meeting, you know that the Town of Springdale has purchased two acres of property on Lion Boulevard. That property is adjacent to the Town Hall parking lot and was part of a larger parcel owned by East Zion VH. We have been in negotiations with the owner for almost a year, and we are pleased that an agreement was reached.

The property was acquired to expand our public campus now and in the future. The most immediate project is construction of a medical clinic building that will be leased to Family Healthcare. As you know, Family Healthcare is currently working out of the modular building purchased from Zion Canyon Medical Clinic (Mike and Helen McMahan). The new building will allow them to offer more services to residents of -- and visitors to -- Springdale. We anticipate that they will offer urgent care, family care, behavioral health care, and a retail pharmacy in the new building. The next step in this process will be to issue a Request for Proposal for architectural design services.

A Fresh Look and Legacy: Completion of the LaFave to Montclair Sidewalk Project

With the recent wrap-up of the LaFave to Montclair Sidewalk Project, our town takes a prideful step forward in connecting our community spaces and enhancing the charm of Zion Park Blvd. This project is about paving pathways and enriching our town's landscape. Central to this vision was adding 15 fruitless mulberry and pistache trees.

These trees serve a dual purpose. Beyond beautifying the area, they carry forward a significant aspect of our town's identity. The choice of mulberry trees is a thoughtful nod to the heritage of Zion Park Blvd., where mulberry trees have been a familiar and comforting sight. While we recognize the inevitability of change, with older trees eventually giving way, these new plantings ensure that the legacy of mulberries lining our streets is preserved for future generations to revel in.

Pistache trees, with their resilience and striking fall color, complement the mulberries perfectly. Their planting along the LaFave to Montclair sidewalk mirrors a similar initiative on Lion Blvd, completed last October, showcasing our commitment to a cohesive and attractive townscape.

The success of these projects has inspired us to look further into expanding this greening initiative to other areas of town. The aim is to replicate the aesthetic and communal benefits achieved here, making our town an even more pleasant place to live and visit.

This endeavor reaches beyond simple beautification. It reflects our commitment to maintaining our town's character and ensuring its vibrancy for generations. The LaFave to Montclair sidewalk, now paralleled by these trees, is a testament to what we can achieve when we invest thoughtfully in our community's infrastructure and environment.

As residents enjoy these new spaces, it's an opportunity to reflect on our collective efforts and the lasting impact of these projects. It's not just about making our town look appealing; it's about creating a sustainable, shared legacy that will continue to grow, much like the trees we've planted.

Zion Shuttle Schedule

Zion shuttles are scheduled to start running in the Town of Springdale and in the park on Sunday, March 3. This start date is designed to help accommodate Spring Break Travelers and relieve traffic in the park and in Springdale.

This year, Zion will continue to roll out new electric shuttle buses. The park's 40 feet electric buses will run in Springdale.

Another short-term project for this property is construction of a building that could be leased to the United States Postal Service. The lease of the current post office building expires in January of 2025 and, while we have not been able to confirm it, we are concerned that the lease will not be renewed at that time. We are working with staff members from Congresswoman Maloy's, Senator Romney's, and Senator Lee's offices to have a conversation with representatives of the USPS. A new, larger building, designed to meet the UPS needs, would solve several problems with the current building (inadequate loading dock, no availability of larger boxes, etc.) as well as provide space to accept UPS packages, open a passport office, and offer a self-serve mailing station.

Finally, we are reserving space on the parcel for a new Town Hall building. We have outgrown the current building, forcing the Police Department to work out of the basement and public meetings (Town Council, Planning Commission, and Historical Preservation Commission) to be held at the Community Center. A new building would accommodate public meetings, allow room to expand services as needed to support the community, add staff as it becomes necessary, and allow the Police Department to occupy all of the current building. This project is several years out, but acquiring this property ensures that there is a "home" for a new building when the time is right.

This property and these buildings are just part of the Town's efforts to provide needs for the future of Springdale 20, 30, or 40 years from now.


