Most of you have probably noticed the sign in Springdale saying that a section of SR-9 has been adopted by Kip and Ashley Gowland. You might also have noticed that one of the wraps on the electrical boxes (near Lion Boulevard) was designed by Ashley. More about both of those things later, but let me introduce you to Kip and Ashley, who are new to the Town of Springdale.

Kip and Ashley moved here from Washington State, where Kip was an engineer for Boeing, and Ashley was a science teacher and assistant principal at the middle and high school levels. As retirement neared, they were looking for a place with a sense of community and easy access to outdoor activities. They are very active: mountain biking, playing pickleball, skiing, canyoneering, and acting as safety patrollers at The Wave in Kane County.

While Kip and Ashley were renting a place in Washington, Utah, and waiting for completion of their house in Springdale, they contacted UDOT about the Adopt a Highway program. The Gowlands have a 2-year commitment to clean both sides of SR-9 from milepost 28 to milepost 30. They are required to clean at least three times a year, but they go out more frequently.

Kip tells a story of cleaning the highway on Mother's Day last year when a large cottonwood tree snapped during a windstorm and hit him on the back of the leg. He's also had several near misses from cars driving on the shoulder (please don't drive there).

Come See the Newly Restored Springdale Bishop's Tithing Granary!

The Historic Preservation Commission has recently completed a restoration project on Springdale's Tithing Granary. This historic structure was built around 1891 and now sits near Town Hall and the Medical Clinic.

We are grateful for all the residents and businesses who contributed to this project through our brick fundraiser. Your commemorative bricks are now laid in front of the granary. We would also like to thank those who volunteered their time and expertise – including Allen Lee for moving the granary onto the new concrete pad, David Pettit for photographing the building and its engravings, and Bob Carlton from the Historic Preservation Commission for guiding the project to completion.

Inside the granary, you can find engravings of donations from past Springdale residents, detailing contributions from 1892 to 1902. This continuity between past and present highlights our community's deep appreciation for this historical building. 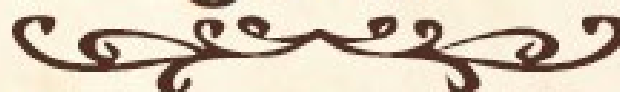
