IT TAKES A VILLAGE

We've all heard the saying that "It takes a village," and this was recently demonstrated in a big way in Springdale.

On September 11, 2024, Willamarie Huelskamp of Springdale was riding her bike in Zion National Park. She ran into another biker, a visitor from Milan, Italy, and struck up a conversation. When she learned that he was on a multi-month bike ride from Alaska to Argentina (followed by a walk through Patagonia to Tierra del Fuego) and was camping every night, she invited him to spend a couple of nights with her and her husband, Ira Rubinfeld. He stayed in their comfortable home for three nights and then continued his journey.

Two days later, Fabio was riding toward Jacob Lake Lodge from Kanab when he saw a semi-rig lose control and roll onto its side. It was sliding toward him, and he knew he had to try to get out of the way. He ran in the opposite direction, but the truck hit his lower legs, resulting in multiple large wounds and fractures. His bicycle and gear were completely demolished. He was life-flighted to the nearest hospital, St. George Regional Hospital, for treatment.

Fabio knew two people in the area -- Willa and Ira - so he called them. They didn't hesitate to sign on to be his caretakers and advocates, and they not only took him back into their house but also drove him to doctor appointments and multiple surgeries over the course of the next 2-1/2 months.

Invasive Species Removal Project – Public Open House February 11

The Town of Springdale has recently received funding to continue removal of invasive trees (Russian olive and tamarisk) from the North Fork and East Fork of the Virgin River and side canyons and washes within Springdale. The Virgin River Watershed provides critical wildlife habitats and is a vital source of water for residents. The project will remove invasive Russian olive (*Elaeagnus angustifolia*) and tamarisk (*Tamarix ramosissima*) trees which threaten the watershed's health by out-competing native trees, channelizing water flows, and degrading wildlife habitats.

Removal of these trees reduces the risk of wildfires, improves fish and wildlife habitats, improves water quality, and can also increase property values. Zion National Park has been working to remove these invasive trees from the Park for the past 25 years. Over the past eight years, the State of Utah has worked directly on the North Fork of the Virgin River to remove most of the invasive trees within the Town of Springdale. This project will extend that work and reduce additional seed banks from spreading downstream to other communities.

We will be holding a public gathering February 11, 2025, at 5:30 pm at the Canyon Community Center to inform the public about this project. Come to this public open house to learn from experts the benefits of removing these invasive trees from the community.

We expect work removing the trees to begin this Fall. The work will be done by trained contractors who will cut the trees, treat the stumps with herbicide, and then remove the cut material from the property. Areas where invasive trees are removed will be revegetated with native willows.

We will be holding workshops and field tours for property owners February 18, 2025, at 1:00 pm at the George Barker River Park. Letters containing an invitation to this workshop have been sent to property owners that have Russian olive and/or tamarisk trees on their property. If you have not received a letter, and believe you have Russian olive or tamarisk trees on your property, please reach out to Kyndal Sagers.






