Kudos to Springdale Public Works Department

I live on the Anasazi Plateau in Springdale, which I believe is the largest subdivision in the Town. On Saturday morning (September 20), I received a call from Joe Barker, Public Works Utility Supervisor, saying that there was a leak in the water line at the bottom of our water tank road. He wanted me to let residents of the Plateau know that the line would be repaired during the night on the next Monday, September 22. Repairs were scheduled overnight to avoid inconveniencing residents.

On Sunday morning at 7:30 a.m., I received a call from Joe as well as a text from Lt. Shafer of the Springdale Police Department saying that the water line had broken, flooding the road and making it impassable. The water tank that serves the subdivision had emptied, leaving the residents without water and destroying a section of the road. The line would have to be repaired immediately.

The Public Works Department went to work, locating the break, draining the water, and even convincing Scholzen Products to open so they could get the necessary parts to repair the 10-inch line. It was a difficult repair, but at 11:30 p.m. it was completed. The crew then stayed and worked through the night, backfilling the road to reopen it.

Voting Information

- Ballots will be mailed out by Washington County beginning Tuesday, October 14th.
- Completed ballots must be received by the Washington County Clerk no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 4th. Please allow time for mailing to ensure your vote counts. There is no longer a postmark deadline.
- If you have not yet registered to vote, you can do so at vote.utah.gov. The registration deadline is Friday, October 24th at 5:00 p.m.

Invasive Species Removal

The Town is gearing up to remove invasive species, Russian olive and tamarisk, along the Virgin River watershed, tributaries, and side washes. The removal of invasive species and planting of native species is free for property owners. Property owners are encouraged to reach out to Staff if they believe they have Russian olive or tamarisk trees on their property. Property owners will be notified in advance before crews begin the process of removing invasive species from their property.

They brought lunch in for the crew around noon and Oscar's Cafe (Hank Moore) provided dinner at the site.


Finally, the residents of the Anasazi Plateau demonstrated resilience and teamwork in getting through a difficult 23-hour period without culinary water (and many without access in or out of the subdivision). I didn't hear any complaints; I only saw texts with people offering drinking water to others that needed it and even offering chlorinated water from their swimming pools for flushing toilets.

This was a fantastic example of how the Springdale community handles adversity, and I'm proud to be the Mayor of the Town.

Chemical products in your home are deemed Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) once they are no longer in use or have passed their expiration date. The potential for their ignitability and toxicity make them hazardous to us and those around us. HHW is not regulated by the Utah Department of Environmental Quality or the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), which is why the Washington County Solid Waste District has taken a proactive approach in seeing that the residents of Washington County have a method to properly dispose of their hazardous materials. We offer our residents Household Hazardous Waste Collection Days throughout the year for your convenience. Thanks for using this service.

Types of Material Accepted

Only on Hazardous Waste days do we accept the following: aerosol cans, bulging batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, fuel, herbicides, medical waste, paint, paint thinners, pesticides, propane, and paint supplies.

This service is **free** for Washington County residents bringing materials from their homes. However, there is a charge for tires.
