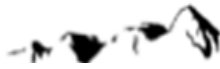

Updates on the George A Barker River Park Expansion Project

Recently, there have been several key updates to the River Park project that we wanted to make you aware of.

Below is an updated site plan showing the incorporation of the new parcel into the park space. The finished park will include updates to the existing restroom facilities, improved parking, a separate pedestrian entrance from the bike path, nature trails, an enlarged central green-space, and a concrete circulation path to improve mobility-impaired access to the park. Based on comments received, this is a scaled-back version from where we started. Thank you for your feedback! We are currently exploring options to ensure access to the other side of the river during construction.

Next, there has been a slight change to the project timeline, which can be viewed below.

- February 11th – Invitation to submit construction bids from qualified contractors
- February 18th – Design Development Review in Planning Commission Regular Meeting
- March 4th – Bid deadline and opening
- March 11th – Notice of award and approval of contract in Town Council Regular Meeting
- March 25th – Notice given to contractor to proceed with construction

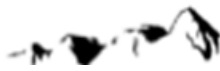


A Night about the Stars

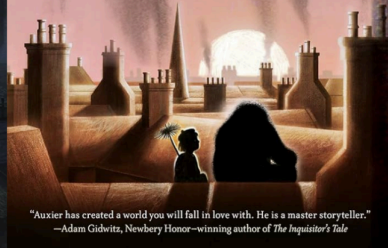
