This month's Mayor's Message is authored by a guest contributor, former Town Mayor Stan Smith. We appreciate his willingness to share insights and perspectives with our community.

Every community has stories—stories of families trying to feel safe, children hoping for better schools, neighbors wishing for cleaner parks, and citizens wanting to feel heard. But too often, those stories stay silent. People notice problems, feel frustration, and hope someone else will fix it. Yet real change begins with something simple and deeply human: **our voices**. When local residents speak to their leaders, they are not just reporting concerns—they are fighting for the place they call home.

Think of the feeling when you drive down the same pothole-ridden road day after day, or when you watch a neighborhood issue worsen because no one reports it. It's easy to feel powerless. But that powerlessness grows when silence takes over. Local leaders cannot fix what they do not know, and communities suffer when people assume their voices do not matter.

But they do matter. Every concern shared is a spark—one that can light the path to solutions.





Leaders are elected to serve the people. When residents speak up, leaders are forced to listen, to respond, and to act. It is a reminder that their decisions affect real lives, not just policies. Your voice tells them, *"We are watching. We care. And we expect you to care too."*

One conversation—just one—can alter the direction of an entire project or policy. Maybe it prevents a harmful decision. Maybe it inspires a new solution. Maybe it makes a leader look at an issue in a way they never had before.


These moments of influence often happen quietly, in small meetings or simple emails, but their effects ripple through the future of the community. When you speak, you are not just fighting for your own concern—you are shaping the place where your neighbors, your children, and future generations will live.

Having a one on one conversation gives both the leader and the resident better understanding. Usually residents show up at a town meeting wanting to voice their concerns and have a dialog with the leaders. Although it might be a place to voice concerns, the true dialog should have happened long before it is on agenda for approval or disapproval. Town leaders are willing to discuss items with you if you give them a chance. A phone call, a personal visit, a text or at least an email to which they can respond.

They are your elected representatives. They cannot speak for you if they do not know your concerns. Realize that even though you express your concerns, others might have differing concerns and the vote might not go how you wanted it to go. Voicing your concerns at least gave your leaders something to think about and discuss.

Talking to local leaders is more than a civic action—it is an act of love for your community. Your voice has power. Use it—and watch your community change because you cared enough to speak.
