A GOAL BECOMES REALITY

On September 7th UDOT will award the SR-9 renewal contract. Once awarded, Springdale will know more about how the project will proceed. We do know that main powerlines along the roadway will be put underground from the Driftwood Lodge to the Park. The Town has worked with UDOT and Rocky Mountain Power for nearly two years to make this a reality. The \$1.5 million-dollar price tag was a stumbling block but I helped the county commissioners understand our need to bury them. In the commissioner's meeting last month, I requested and was granted the money needed for installation. Town staff has worked hard acquiring the land and right of ways needed. We sincerely thank all the residents and businesses who helped make this happen. This is a huge victory for the Town and a goal many have wanted for years.

The Town of Springdale is excited to announce the launch of its re-designed website on Wednesday, September 6th. The website will feature a fresh, updated look with a number of enhanced features and functionality. Improvements will include:

- ✓ A cleaner, more intuitive user interface with navigation elements designed to quickly point people to information
- ✓ An alert center to post emergency notices which can then be transmitted via email or text message to residents
- ✓ A "search" feature to help users find exactly what they want
- ✓ Archived minutes and agendas can be searched by key word or date
- ✓ A "notify me" feature allowing residents to sign up to receive reminders or event notifications specific to their interests
- ✓ Online bill pay and commerce functions
- ✓ Several popular forms are fillable and can be submitted online
- ✓ Synchronization of selected website content to social networking sites

It's great to be able to buy something and then ask right then and there how you could cook it. Springdale's market adds yet another layer of local support by providing a stage for homegrown music. Zion Harvest is the non-profit that presently runs Springdale's market and helps provide residents and visitors alike with access to fresh, nutritious, local and seasonal food. After 12 years of making the market the best it can be Zion Harvest has seen a decline in local patrons - the bottom line is without you, there is no market.

ONLINE BILL PAYMENT FACTS

5. Select your billing organization and follow the prompts for linking your bill.
6. Once your bill is added to your account, you can add another bill, view and pay your bill online, or setup a recurring auto payment schedule.
