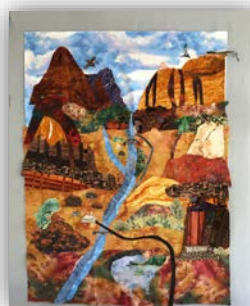

Disc Golf Anyone?

Disc Golf is currently one of the fastest growing sports in the world. And many of our Zion visitors are familiar with it. The Town of Springdale has provided an 18-hole Disc Golf Course for them and us. Course installation began in March 2016 and completed in November 2017.



Disc Golf can also be called frisbee golf. The frisbees/discs used differ in weight, stability and speed in order to drive off the tee, approach the basket, deal with awkward positions, with the ultimate goal to putt into the chains of the basket. Just like traditional golf there are Par 3, 4, and 5. However, Par 3 is the most common.

The course was originally conceived by town management, the parks department and local Disc golfer Brett Chaffin. Continued planning, design and installation was done by Brett with the generous help of Eddie Staton and Ned Farnsworth.

There are a few discs that are available at the library and the course map is at the entrance to the baseball field. Don't hesitate to approach Disc golfers on the course because most are willing to teach. Springdale/Zion Canyon Department of Public Safety News

A few weeks ago, Springdale Officers responded to a report of a hit and run accident and located a damaged rock bench. After searching the area, officers found a heavily damaged vehicle owned by a local worker. Officers further investigated and arrested the worker for DUI, open container, and leaving the scene of an accident. Luckily, no pedestrians were injured.

Since January 1, 2018, officers have responded to 13 accidents in our area. Last year the police responded to 72 accidents. Now the busy season has arrived, tourists will be piling into town. Please take extra time when driving, don't drink and drive, and buckle up.

- Bordatella (kennel cough): \$12
- Rattlesnake Vaccine: \$20

CATS:

- FVRCP (feline viral rhinotracheitis, calicivirus, panleukopenia vaccine): \$18
- FELV (feline leukemia vaccine): \$15

MICROCHIP AND REGISTRATION: \$35

ADDITIONAL SERVICE PROVIDED BY THE TOWN OF SPRINGDALE:

- **Dog Licensing (due May 1, 2018):** \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs; \$40 for unaltered dogs

Springdale Community Quilt Block Instructions

Due Date: May 4th, 2018, 2 PM to Springdale Town Offices

We are looking for your help to create a quilt block for a community quilt to hang in the Springdale Community Center. The quilt will be displayed on the wall of the auditorium to be enjoyed by all attending presentations and events.

Theme: Showcase your pride in our beautiful community - think special events, historic themes, nature as well as traditional blocks that represent our area.

Size: minimum size is a finished 6-inch square or 24's" in total perimeter, maximum size is a finished size of 12 X 18 inches or a perimeter of 60 inches. Each block should include a seam allowance of ½ inch. (For example, a 6-inch finished block should measure 7 inches before it is sewn into the quilt)

Material: Cotton fabric – any material that is not cotton must be stabilized so it can easily be sewed into the quilt without stretching. Include any extra strips of the fabric used in the block to be used elsewhere in the quilt. Strips to include should be minimum of 1 inch and max of 7 inches by width of fabric or at least 20 inches long.

Colors: think Zion Canyon Colors for inspiration a color Palette is available at the Springdale Town Hall. And posted on the following bulletin boards, Springdale Library, Springdale, Rockville, Virgin Post Office's. Think orange, red, rust, brown, blue, yellow, green, purple.

Community Sew Day- Have a design in mind, just not sure how to make it come on **April 9th 2018 - 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm at the Springdale Community Center** . Bring your design and fabric choices – we will have additional fabric available (if you don't have any) to supplement your design and will help you.

Embellishments: Please keep all embellishments off your block until the quilt has been quilted

Block Drop Off: The block can be dropped off anytime during regular business hours to the Springdale town office until 3pm on May 4th 2018, please have block in a clear plastic bag with your name on a piece of paper pinned to the block and include any additional strips of fabric (between 1 inch to 7 inches) that we can use elsewhere in the quilt. A donation of \$5.00 is being asked to pay for professional quilting services. Additional funding for quilting services is being explored.
