We lost another long-time Springdale resident. Jerry Hatch moved here with his family in the late 60's and owned and operated the Shell station for decades. He served the community as a Council member and helped make Springdale what it is today. Jerry will be missed.

Zion National Park continues to work on the Visitor Use Management Plan. As a cooperating agent, Springdale is participating in the discussion. Managing the complexity of visitor issues is not easy but Superintendent Bradybaugh has brought together varying opinions and perspectives to find solutions. When the draft is complete, it will be released for public review and comment later this year.

Determining the transit system from St. George to Springdale is also a complicated process. Stakeholders are currently working on the governance and structure of the system. Given the number of municipalities involved coming to a consensus has been challenging but everyone agrees the system is needed. Progress should accelerate in the coming months. I will keep our community informed.

A Happy Place for Bikes

New custom designed bike racks will soon be showing up all over Town. These racks will give you one more reason to ride your bike for in-town errands, commuting, and recreation. Local artist and metal worker Adrian Player designed the racks, which are rusted metal with the Town logo prominently displayed in the middle.

The first two racks were recently installed at the Town Hall. Additional racks will soon be installed at the Canyon Community Center, Town Park / multi-use athletic courts, River Park, and downtown at the Pizza Noodle shuttle stop. Additional locations will be added in the future. Use these racks to park your bike while you enjoy a meal downtown, catch a high-intensity game of pickleball, check out a book from the library, or take in all the drama at a Town Council meeting. To make sure your bike is secure, please provide your own lock.



In addition to the new bike racks, both the Pizza Noodle shuttle stop and River Park will also soon have bike repair stations and water bottle filling stations installed. The bike repair stations will have an assortment of commonly needed tools and a floor pump to handle all your basic bike repair needs.

With the recent bike lanes added on SR-9 and these new bike racks and repair stations there has never been a better time to ride a bike in Springdale. Get out on your bike and discover the fun and convenience of getting around Town by pedal power.

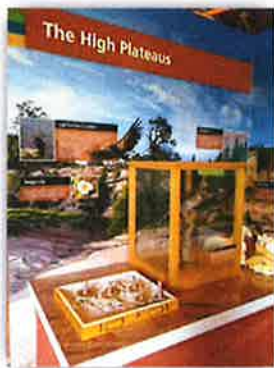


Declaration of Candidacy

Don't Waste Springdale

Next to the recycling binnies on Lion Blvd. there are two recycling containers (one that is cardboard only and one for comingled recycling) and one trash dumpster. While the recycling containers and dumpster are emptied regularly, they are often quickly filled again each week. The binnies and recycling containers and the dumpster are provided by the landfill and Republic Services for the residents of Springdale to use, not for business use. The dumpster allows larger items that don't fit into the resident's trash bin to be collected and recycling containers allow for the recycling of cardboard, which is not part of the County's recycling binnie program. Businesses have their own contracts with waste collection companies for waste and recycling collection.

Over the past several months, the Town has been cleaning up trash, old furniture and other debris that has been left on the ground in front of or around the dumpster and recycling containers.

"Don't Waste Utah" was an anti-littering slogan several years back. Please be respectful of others. If the bin is full, don't put your trash on the ground. Dumping items on the ground is illegal. Further it impacts others that have to clean up the mess, impacts neighboring properties as the wind blows trash around, and shows a general lack of respect for the community. It's unfortunate that we need to make these statements, but the bad actions of a few make it that way. The area around the binnies and dumpsters is under surveillance and those found to be dumping illegally will be prosecuted. If you witness anyone illegally dumping, please contact the Police Department.
