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Community Based Design Process



After acquiring property adjacent to the existing George A. Barker River Park located at 1751 Zion Park Blvd, the Town of Springdale, partnered with ASSIST Community Design Center to engage the local community in the design process of the park expansion and redevelopment. The Town's objective for the expansion and redevelopment of the park is to respect the current character of the park while also strategically expanding its utility for all community members.


