



## **Transient Lodging Good Neighbor Policy Template**

*Applicants for Lodging facilities must provide the Community Development Department with a Good Neighbor Policy which must be conspicuously posted in each facility.*

Please review and follow these **Good Neighbor** guidelines throughout your stay to help ensure Springdale remains a safe, enjoyable, and beautiful community.

### **BE CONSIDERATE OF SPRINGDALE RESIDENTS AND THEIR PROPERTIES**

- Respect the residential properties in Springdale. Springdale is home to wonderful and caring residents. Please treat them and their property as you would like to be treated.
- Pick up after yourself and keep the property and the Town clean and free of trash and debris.
- Park only in designated parking spaces on the property. Do not park in the parking lots on adjacent properties. Be aware that all on-street parking is either paid parking or resident permit parking.
- Keep noise to a minimum, especially during the quiet hours of 8 pm- 7 am. Refrain from using amplified music outside at all times. Quiet hours apply to pool / hot tub and outdoor areas as well. These quiet hours are enforced by Springdale Town Ordinance.

### **TRANSPORTATION**

- Most destinations in Springdale are within walking or biking distance or are accessible on the free shuttle service operated by Zion National Park. We encourage you to leave your vehicle at the rental property and walk or bike to destinations in Springdale, and to take the shuttle when visiting Zion National Park. Doing so avoids hassles with parking and reduces traffic in Town.
- When you must drive your vehicle, drive slowly and courteously on all streets and obey all traffic and parking regulations. Be aware of pedestrians and cyclists, particularly near crosswalks.

### **PUBLIC AND MEDICAL SERVICES**

- Medical Clinic. There is a full-service medical clinic located at 120 Lion Boulevard.
- Police. The Town of Springdale has a full-time police department. For non-emergency public safety issues, call police dispatch at 435-634-5730. For emergencies call 911.
- Library. The Springdale Branch of the Washington County Public Library is located inside the Canyon Community Center at 126 Lion Boulevard. The library offers computer access and free WiFi.

### **RESPECT OUR NATURAL ENVIRONMENT**

Zion Canyon's spectacular scenery is enjoyed by millions of people each year. Here are some ways you can help keep the scenery and environment spectacular:

- Protect our night sky. Turn off outdoor and indoor lights when not in use.
- Respect wildlife. Do not feed or approach local wildlife.
- Care for the Virgin River. The Virgin River is one of Springdale's most treasured assets. It is a wonderful place to relax and connect with nature. Please help keep the River healthy by using approved restroom facilities while hiking in and around the River.

- Please be fire conscious. Depending on the time of year and the conditions, fire restrictions may be in place. Even if fire restrictions are not in place, only use approved devices and never leave a fire unattended. Fireworks of any kind are prohibited.

#### **PETS**

- Promptly clean up after your pets. Prevent excessive and prolonged barking, keep pets on leash when outdoors, and control aggressive pets.
