- Self Guided Visual Pathway Through Town

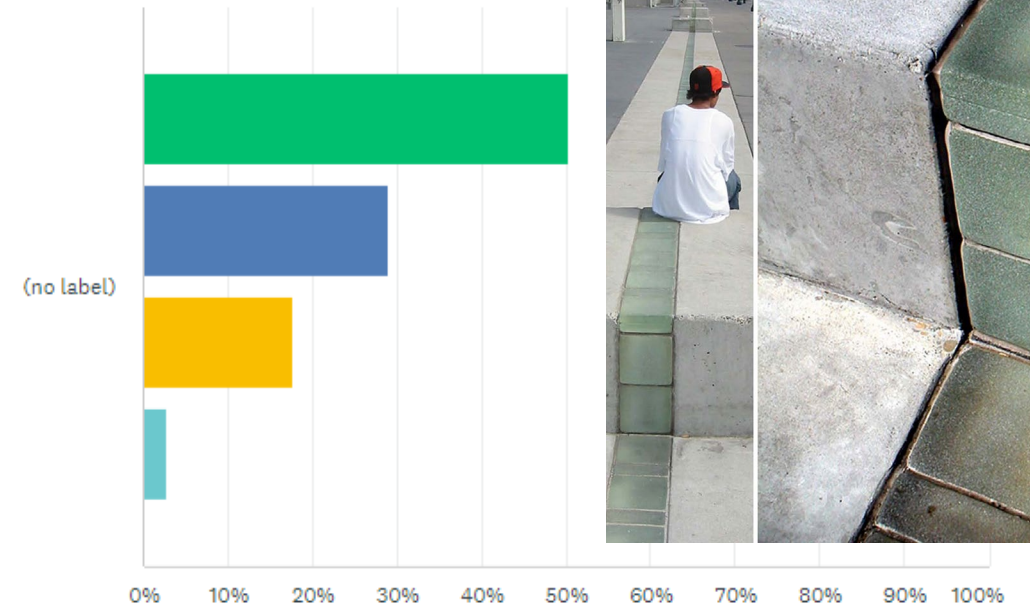

Major Take-Aways

- The streetscape desperately needs shade
- More seating is necessary, and not just at the shuttle stops
- There needs to be more trashcans and regularly scheduled emptying
- Many people are in favor of public restrooms at the SR 9 property
- Need to get bicycles off the sidewalks
- Crosswalks need to be improved: location, material, and visibility
- Pedestrian accessibility and identification need to be improved at the park's entrance
- Implementation of public art should be purposeful and meaningful
- Interpretative signage highlighting history, geology, culture, or astronomy would be beneficial throughout the town
- There needs to be more representation of the Paiute people and history in the area
- Support for splash pad or water feature at SR-9 property with caveat of finding a solution to water usage

Elementary School

Meeting Date: 08.23.2022, 1:00 PM

Attendees:

- Kyla Topham – Resident

Meeting Notes:

- Any interactive or gathering elements have a negative outlook from most people in the area
- The elementary school has a bit of a bad image from the older residents
 - Feels there is a lack of community here
 - Thinks people want to keep the area sophisticated

- We will produce separate boards for the kids to vote one
 - Should include topics like history, wildlife, etc.
- Would like to see a place where the kids can play in the water and cool off that isn't in the "poison river"

UDOT

Meeting Date: 08.25.2022, 3:30 PM

Meeting Notes:

- There are concerns with the limited right-of-way
- The crosswalk types should be limited to thermal plastics
 - These must be applied directly to the type of pavement
 - Not cut out or pavers
- Cautious of the painted surfaces because it creates lower friction surfaces
 - Doesn't completely rule it out but more discussion is needed
- Flashing beacons generally have a hard time with UDOT's policies
- We will have future, more in-depth conversations about possibilities and constraints

Art and History Enthusiasts

Meeting Notes:

- There are not enough crosswalks in town
 - People just cross wherever they want to
 - They will park on one side of the road and run across to the shuttle stops
 - Tourists driving don't stop at the crosswalks wither like their supposed to
 - Need to place crosswalks where they are actually needed – areas of high traffic near the bus stops and post office
 - Shuttle stop 4 has no bench, shade, or trashcans
- There need to be more trashcans
 - All of them are always full and there is trash on the street

- Especially apparent near the pizza place
 - People will dump their trash in planters or anywhere they want
- There need to be more benches to relax or take in the scenery
 - These should be placed away from the shuttle stops
- There needs to be more shade and more trees
- There should be a public restroom with shade and seating nearby
 - There shouldn't be any parking here – it should be walk up so it promotes walking
- The town is overrun with tourists and we need to make sure that they are accommodated
- Must get bikers off of the sidewalk and into the bike lanes
 - It's very dangerous for both the riders and pedestrians
 - Need to finish the multi-use trail that runs through the town
- The self-guided trail is a good idea to help direct people to the park
 - Pedestrians rarely walk into the park, they just use the shuttle or bike in
 - Could be a historic walk that highlights town's history
 - Would like to see something embedded into the sidewalk
- The pedestrian entrance/shuttle area is confusing and gets very congested
- Need to keep in mind the type of art and the angles for viewing
 - Taller elements are best viewed up a hillside and not in the way of a major view
 - The existing low sign works because it is low and highlights the view
 - The existing sign competes with the majestic view sign
- Benches are a great opportunity for public art
 - Could have a contest each year for the design
 - Should consider the consistency with these though
- It would be nice to have water fountains throughout the town that help cool things off and create pleasant microclimates
- There are 5 of the manhole tortoises in the town with interpretive signs
 - Locals know about them but visitors generally don't
- Shouldn't funnel people to one hotspot, but rather direct people to multiple areas of interest
- Would love to see a water feature at the SR9 property
 - If the river wasn't so polluted there could be a spot to play, but it's unsafe
 - With water use being a contentious issue, there should be an alternative
 - Hotels in the area use a ton of water for lawns that don't serve any purpose
 - Try and get the hotels to return the lawn to desert plantings and then use the water for the public interests
- Historic preservation tore up old canal rocks and could use them in some capacity
- Mosaics or artwork on the ground to orient yourself to the surrounding landscape would be really nice for visitors
 - Could have binoculars here pointed at the mountains
- Provide more access to the side trails that only the locals know about
 - The more people that can enjoy Springdale the better
- Should consider more use for the OC Tanner Amphitheater

- The public gathering nodes would require some convincing for collaboration or partnership with the local businesses/private owners
 - People won't use these areas unless they are shaded
 - Nicely placed picnic areas would be nice
 - Umbrellas are not an option because they blow away
- There needs to be more lighting to highlight side roads
 - Others think that there doesn't need to be any more lights
 - Bollards would improve public safety
 - People like the lights near the Watchman Visitor Center and Feel Love Coffee
- Can have planters that are sponsored and maintained by people
 - The city won't take care of any planted areas
- There are opportunities to use the old canal for something
 - Or highlight that its actually there
 - People had fallen into there before
- The retaining walls across from the post office are dangerous
 - Kids often climb on them and there are spiders and scorpions
- Big Springs Road is public and should be made more appealing and safer
 - Could be better landscaped and traffic calming could be introduced through there
 - There are no fire hydrants along the road here
 - Would be nice if the town didn't "bastardize" it and actually took care of the road
- Consider slowing down speed limit and introduce traffic calming
 - People speed upright at the post office
- Derelict properties need to be improved

Zion Canyon Offerings

Meeting Date: 09.01.2022, 2:00 PM

Attendees:

Meeting Notes:

- The existing gateway sign is good how it currently is
 - Less statement is important – the signage should detract from the views
- All provided examples of sidewalk environments are too busy
- There used to be a planter in front of the shop, but it got taken away
- Would like to see greenery in front of the store rather than the rock beds
 - Need to be careful with vertical elements do not to block views and must preserve the sightline of the parking access
 - Pay attention to the placement of trees as to not block the storefront or views of the landscape
- Even with shade the pavement and hardscape get quite hot
 - There is not a lot of area to work with

- The public/private gathering nodes wouldn't apply to every business.
 - Need to be intentional in identifying what properties could best provide these
 - These areas must have shade. Misters here would also be nice
- Would like to avoid large signs or lights at crosswalks to preserve the natural beauty in Springdale
- Continuation of the mosaic program through the town would be nice to see
 - Rock sculptures are another option
- It would be nice to have an official dog park for the residents and one for visitors
 - Should also look to include pet friendly water fountains all over
 - The existing park and trail are nice
- A splashpad at the SR9 property would be amazing, but the water use is an issue
 - Culinary water is expensive and irrigation water is brown right now
- Educational signage would be beneficial, but people won't stop to read them if there isn't any shade
 - Can have the binoculars near these pointed at the geology
- Hide and seek elements could incorporate animals found in Zion
- Pocket parks with shade would be nice along the road
- People staying in the hotels need something to do at night
- Not a fan of the new streetlights in town
 - There are a lot of dark patches along the street
- There are currently not enough seating opportunities here
 - These can't be metal and must be shaded
- Prefers simplicity

Outdoor/Bike Enthusiasts

Meeting Date: 09.01.2022, 3:30 PM

Attendees:

- Scott Williams – Bike Shop Owner

Meeting Notes:

- Biking on the sidewalks is a major issue
 - Bike businesses are falling short on reinforcing the bike rules
 - The town is focused on getting riders into the bike lanes
- The liaison program is going great
 - Trying to make things harmonious between the renters, the town, drivers, and the park
 - The Park can't tell businesses how to run their business – that's where the liaison program comes in
- The current crosswalks are not effective for bikes. There needs to be a better way of identifying these.
 - Could add flashing beacons similar to the one near Majestic View

- The town is a bit negative and hesitant to add in more signage of any sort
 - Inset lighting could be an alternative that is less intrusive but still catches the drivers' attention
 - Look into crosswalk flagging option similar to Cedar City or Colorado Springs
 - Could have a turkey sculpture as the flag holder and the flags become its tail feathers
- The pedestrian access into the park is very confusing for visitors
 - The right-turn lane and bike lane access have conflicts
 - There is a lack of good signage to direct them down into the Cable Mountain property to the pedestrian access
 - We could use the visual pathway to better direct people to the park's pedestrian entrance
 - There needs to be a crosswalk on the exit closer to the park for both bicyclists and pedestrians
- Should encourage people to walk from farther stops
- There should be bike signage and infrastructure along other town streets
- Prioritize getting people off of the main roadway
 - Re-route bikers through the neighborhood
 - The current multi-use pathway isn't very functional
 - Be prepared for the bike trail that's coming from LaVerkin
 - It would be nice to see a bike stand/repair station and water station along this
- Any plantings should be native and drought-tolerant
 - Large pots could be nice in areas that lack color
- Would like to see some reference to the native culture on the educational opportunities
 - Geological signs similar to the ones on the Pa'rus trail would also be helpful
- The splashpad is a good idea but be wary of the proximity to the street
 - Figure out how to collect gray water and treat it
- Public restrooms would be amazing
 - There are none between Sol Foods and the park
- Artwork should be rotated so that it keeps continual interest for residents

Public Meeting Walking Tours

Meeting Date: 09.01.2022, 6:00 PM

Meeting Notes:

- People like the trees along Lion Blvd., however the city maintenance has been having issues with them and had to take some out
- Would like to see even more trees along sidewalks where possible
- Many were fans of the mosaics that had been done
- The crosswalk at Lion Blvd. and SR 9 needs to be improved
 - Remove the crosswalk signage from the area where there isn't one
 - Add a crosswalk across Lion Blvd.

- Crosswalks in general should be improved
 - Make them higher visibility
 - Introduce some sort of traffic calming to slow drivers
 - Rumble strips, speed bumps, or speed table crosswalks
 - Could include lights on the existing crosswalk signs in the middle of the roadway
- Should be careful about over-signing
- Many people liked the retaining walls
- They will be putting in a new plaque along the historic irrigation canal section that has been left intact
- There should be benches and shade at every shuttle stop
- Concerns with road noise at the SR 9 property
 - Will this location be for residents or visitors?
- Watch the height and obstruction of plantings while also adding variety to the plant beds
- Art/benches/planters might be problematic
- The town needs more trash cans but find a way to hide them
- No one is aware that there is a school in the middle of the town
 - There are many blind spots from driveways
- Observation binoculars should be incorporated near the old canal sign
- Boiler Park in Washington City has nice individual seating

Cable Mountain Lodge

Meeting Date: 09.02.2022, 9:00 AM

Attendees:

- Nate Wells – Resident, Owner

Meeting Notes:

- Despite best efforts, a lot of people still try and enter the park entrance from the road
 - Need to find a way to help guide people down into the Cable Mountain Lodge property for the pedestrian access
 - This property should be an extension of the plan through the town
 - Nate is “100% on board and willing to participate”
- Thinks the first option for monument signage would work well on this side of the town
- There is a major need for a crosswalk at the northern exit from the property
 - This is a location that it’s critical to have a high visibility crosswalk here given the traffic
- Proposed an idea to emphasize artwork with easel sculptures through Springdale that you can see the inspiration or stand where the artist was when they painted the featured piece
 - Similar to Van Gough artwork in France
- Restrooms at the SR9 property would be excellent
 - There are only two public restrooms: Soul Foods on one end and then at the rental place here

- Sees thousands of people use the restrooms here every day
- Loves the idea of more educational panels
 - These should emphasize the tradition of art in the canyon as well as pioneer and Native American history in the area
 - “It’s embarrassing that there’s not more representation of the Paiute people
 - “Stories in the Sky” educational panel explaining the night sky and constellations
- Would love having the walking tour through town
 - This would encourage people to walk through town to the park rather than waiting for the shuttle
 - People want an enriching experience as they walk through Springdale
- There are some spaces between the streetlights that get really dark at night

Healthy Lifestyle Advocates

Meeting Date: 09.02.2022, 10:30 AM

Meeting Notes:

- You wouldn’t believe the amount of people that visit but don’t know where the park is even at
- The existing sign is loved by the community and should stay
 - Any new signs should be low-lying and made of natural materials so they blend in with surroundings
- Doesn’t think there needs to be a side on the north side of town that signifies that you’re in Springdale
 - The town and the park share an experience – it’s all a part of the canyon
 - A sign doesn’t necessarily make you want to stop here
- Loved that the road used to turn red once you hit the town limits
- Doesn’t think that the visual pathway is necessary
- Biggest concern is that they don’t want Springdale to turn into the typical gateway town
- There should be more public drinking fountains that you can use without a water bottle
 - Dog accessible water fountains would be nice
 - There are mixed feelings regarding waste bags for dogs
 - Don’t like the idea of a fenced off-leash dog area
- Doesn’t love the idea of an overpopulation of art just because
 - The implementation should be purposeful and subtle
- Makes sense to have gathering spaces where there are activities to do there
 - Shops, restaurants, and retail
- The quietness of the town is important
- Would like to keep things simple and doesn’t like the clutter and a ton of gadgets
- There should be more shade at the shuttle stops without horrible design

- Anything to help with educational opportunities is welcome
 - The town put up panels near the Majestic but they are blank
- Make public restrooms truly public
- A mini desert garden could be nice in the SR9 property
 - There could be an option to buy the featured plants at a local shop
- Bikers are important but so are the pedestrians
 - You can fill up tires and fix bikes 10 different places in town but there are no pedestrian-friendly water fountains anywhere

Zion National Park

Meeting Date: 09.02.2022, 1:00 PM

Attendees:

- Jeff Bradybaugh – Park Superintendent

Meeting Notes:

- They generally don't have any binoculars in the park, but that doesn't mean it can't be done in the town
- Try to keep signage and information consistent between the park and the town
 - They have professionals that make the interpretive signs that may be able to help
 - Signage at shuttle stops in town should match the National Park theme
 - Town would coordinate with the park for the signs to have the same theme and formats
- Any plantings should be drought tolerant natives
 - Non-natives basically become weeds and cause issues
 - The park's vegetation manager and the town should have approved native plant lists
- There have been issues with deer and other animals coming into town
 - The park and town have gone through efforts to educate the residents on deer-resistant plantings
 - Prey (the deer) brings the predators that are not necessarily welcome in town
 - Bighorns, however, will generally stay out of the town
- The park has unique plants and animal species that can be highlighted on informational signs
 - The Zion Snail that only exists in the park in the sky gardens
 - There are 2 plant species that are only found in the park
- Signage should reinforce the 'Leave No Trace' principals
- There is always a need for another restroom
- Should be wary of over-lighting areas; there is no reason to get locked into the engineering standards for lighting
 - People are able to navigate well without as much light as you would think
 - Solar lighting in the park works well
- Any suggestions with the park entrance and pedestrian access interface would be welcome
 - Wayfinding and directional signage, especially here, is so important
 - A crosswalk at this location would be well suited and is much needed
- Crosswalk lighting inset into the roadway is a good thought
 - Will remove the need for intrusive signage
